

Legacy 2026 Summer High School Missions Trip

July 12-17, 2026

We are excited to have the opportunity to go serve the YWAM Mazatlan base for our 4th year! Our church has been blessed to have deep relationship with this ministry base for the last 20+ years. Our pastors Chris and Jena Hippe have ministered there regularly, as well as City Central prayer teams, and we are excited to continue this partnership with our students! (ywammazatlan.com)

Trip Cost

- \$1200 (covers airfare, housing, food, misc. travel expenses)

Registration and Application Process

1. Parents (even those of 18 year old students) may register their child starting Jan 20. This registration serves as a placeholder for the student.
2. Students will also need to fill out a student application that is separate from the parent registration form within 15 days of them being registered for the trip. This will be sent to them once they are registered for the trip.
3. Student and parent will be confirmed that student's spot is secured after application is reviewed.

* There are approximately 27-28 seats reserved for students.

** Student applications are very beneficial in order to hear from a student the reasons they desire to attend a missions trip, hear where they are at in their faith journey and have them take a step of ownership in the process.

Trip Financial Deadlines

1. Registration is open Jan 20 to hold student's place with a deposit of \$50.
2. \$750 due by April 10 to reserve student's plane ticket.
3. Student's remaining balance is due by July 10.

* Registration closes March 31 or earlier depending on applications received.

Refunds - Once student/family pays for April 10th's airfare amount of \$750, student's name is assigned to a plane ticket, and this becomes nonrefundable per the airline. Any student deciding to cancel their spot, must do so before April 10. Cancellations before April 10 can be refunded in full. (In the event that a student has to cancel after April 10, the only way to refund funds already paid, is if legacy youth leadership is able to find a student who can be a replacement.

Who can come?

- Current 9-12th graders for the 2025-26 school year. Students who will be 9th graders in August/September of 2026 are not eligible this year.

Travel Information to and from Mazatlan :

- Passport Book : Student's will need to have a current Passport **Book** by the date of the trip. Instructions are below to obtain or renew passport. Make sure passport will not expire within 6 months or less of trip.

- Notarized Letter of Consent : Student under 18 will need a notarized letter of consent. This is an extra safety measure as students are not traveling with parents.
- Luggage : 1 carry-on and 1 personal item is allowed.

What will students be doing in Mexico?

We will be partnering with the following available ministries during the week of our trip :

- Homes of Hope
Ministry providing adequate housing for local families in need. Assisting with building a home as well as laying a foundation for God in their lives.
- YWAM Ships
Ministry exists to bring hope and the gospel to isolated and least reached communities on the islands off the coast.
- Street Ministry
Ministry hosts church services on the streets and feeds the homeless and all run by young
- Club de Futbol
Uniting kids over soccer to provide a safe place where kids can come and play.
- Racham, "Compassion", Children's Ministry
Provides a safe place for kids where they can discover their identity and vocation calling. Works together with families in the communities to help all discover their purpose in life and secure their rights as citizens.
- Monte Bello
Ministry to provide educational and spiritual development resources to low income families through health and hygiene programs, bible themed classes, small groups and mentoring programs for kids and youth.
- Surf and Skate
Ministry teaching kids how to surf and skate, with focus of loving those who come and teaching them about the love of Jesus.
- Immigrant Ministry
Ministry that reaches immigrants of Mexico with food and prayer and building relationships.
- Hospital Ministry
Ministry that heads to local hospitals to love on those in need, providing worship, prayer and food.
- Rehab Ministry

Visits groups of children-young adults who are in a period of rehab for drug abuse.
Provides
times of worship, biblical teaching and relationship to those in need.
